This issue of the Bhavan's Patrikaa features a new project that engages all grades of the school, starting from KIndergarten all the way to Class 12. Under the guidance of our Vice Principal, Smt. Rajalakshmi B, our school has now incorporated the theme, trees in different projects and their own independent endeavours. This was organised to not only showcase the talents of our students but also to teach us what an integral part of our lives trees are.

All the subject departments ensured that their students had a truly rich learning experience.

Kindergarten teachers took this as an opportunity to introduce the children to different types of trees in the school as they enjoyed their nature walk. Creative activities nurtured their love for both trees and art. As did the toddlers' Chipko Movement as it helped them strike an emotional bond with the trees. Under the watchful eye of the teachers, some even learnt to climb trees!

Class 1 & 2 made expressive posters on trees throughout the different seasons and the uses of plants as an EVS activity. Class 3 focused on the interesting companions of trees that are arboreal animals. Class 4 found a creative way to learn idioms using trees. These projects helped them hone their artistic skills while also teaching them subjects that enrich their knowledge.

Class 5 & 7 were enlightened on the different features of trees during their nature walk in our school as they collected data for their mathematics project. Class 7 chose to explore the matter more thoroughly by mapping out the area covered by different types of trees in the country.

Class 8 presented a qualitative report on how to ascertain the age of trees by counting the cambium rings of a cross section of the trunk. Class 11 used information from their mathematics syllabus to study methods of agriculture to create produce of optimum quality and quantity and other growth patterns. Each of these projects were truly fascinating and served as an eye-opener to both students and teachers.

TREES Kindergarten

Trees are an important part of the ecosystem providing humans with many important resources. Based on the topic - Trees, the teachers of the kindergarten spoke to the children about the importance of trees. The teachers took their respective classes for a nature walk around the school campus. The children were encouraged to identify the different types of trees such as lemon tree, mango tree, coconut tree, etc.



The hands-on activities like 'leaf-rubbing' and 'leaf-sticking', in their creativity book, were some of the activities that were carried out to evoke their creativity. Our tiny tots mimicked the "Chipko Movement" by hugging the trees which created an emotional bond.







Rhymes were sung based on various trees and several stories were narrated to the children in the activity room. The children collected leaves of trees which had fallen on the playground. While the teachers monitored, a few children tried to safely climb a tree. This activity was executed to build confidence, gain strength and to become close and personal with their favourite tree in the playground. Later, they sat under a tree for a while and relaxed themselves.

How trees look different?

It is very important to talk to young children about what they see and experience in the environment and to educate them with new words to build their vocabulary. Learning about the four seasons of the year and how a tree changes according to the season was something the children were fascinated about.



The students of Class 1 presented a wonderful poster work on the topic 'HOW TREES LOOK IN DIFFERENT SEASONS'. This activity helped the children to develop their vocabulary, thinking skills, creativity and observation skills which is crucial for their overall development.

Class 3 focused on the topic 'Arboreal Animals'. Students collected several facts about these animals and exhibited them through their innovative charts and posters.

The students of Class 4 were guided to make an exciting arrangement of the idioms they had learnt. They made very prosperous idiom trees.

Students of class 9 were asked to make a poster on the topic – Trees and give a slogan for the same. The students completed the activity enthusiastically and presented the same very beautifully. They spread the message of why we should save trees and how important it is to grow a tree for the survival of a living being.

Computer Science


Computer science students collaborated to come up with codes that allowed users to draw trees using solely programming language.

Commerce

A statistical analysis of deforestation, elucidating numerous data related to the travesty in terms of numbers was conducted by students. They also explored and wrote a report on concepts like Pythagorean tree, Fibonacci sequence etc.



TREES

The real world application of mathematics was explored by the students of our school who conducted a series of activities integrating mathematical concepts and trees, to understand the same. The students of class 5 and 7 did projects dealing with data handling and visualisation. The former collected their own data regarding the different types of trees on our school campus in a nature walk and represented it with the help of pictographs, bar graphs, etc. The latter took a more topographic approach and mapped out the area covered by different types of forests in our country.

The young children of primary, from classes 1 to 4, used leaves to understand the concepts of measurement and symmetry while simultaneously honing their artistic and motor skills with the help of leaf painting and tracing methods. The 6th grade students achieved the same through a project on flower patterns.

The higher classes took a more scientific approach to the project, with the students of class 8 doing a qualitative report on the method to ascertain the age of a tree by counting the rings in its cross section.

The students of class 11-A presented the numerous ways math can be applied to plants. Their presentations covered a wide range of ideas including the role of relations and functions in providing optimal produce, and the practical benefits of grafting branches and stems in an elliptical manner. They also related mathematical concepts like fractals and the Fibonacci series to plant growth and structure. The other students of class 11, did a statistical analysis of deforestion breaking down the data into numbers, and yet others drew up codes that enabled users to draw trees in different programming languages.

"A book can wait a thousand years unread until the right reader happens to come along"






Musical Performance


