
KG Christmas Celebration

KG Sports Day


The Kindergarten Sports Day was held on 13th January 2024.

Coast Guard Quiz






The stamps themselves are an important part of the collection.

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
Project Day

Cartoons are to educate kids, make them laugh and relish the overall experience. They never forget to put a smile on the kid's faces. The definition of a cartoon in simple words, is an animation that usually works with fictional characters. An exaggerated, abstract version of real life. A child's mind... The craziest, silliest and most childish events put together is a cartoon. They extend over several movies, tv shows and so many more to introduce us to a magical world of dumb and hilarious, but unforgettable characters. And through this article, we are going through cartoons, in and out.


Hundreds of artists work together to create this amazing piece of art and thousand more editors and technicians bring it into motion. They get inspiration from somewhere, design the characters, sketch them, give them their colour and silhouette, add extra details, create the story, make the dialogues, create backgrounds, use Computer Generated Imagery (CGI) or the flipbook method to bring in motion, find a production company, name the cartoon, advertise it and release it. It is a long, LONG, process.

There are various art styles in which cartoons are spread across. From anime to chibi drawing to the Simpsons style, each one of them holds a special nostalgic feel to it. But the style has to be simple. Something, unforgettable. Something, like a 3-year-old kid can draw. Simple and basic shapes for faces, round eyes and nose, cartoon-y smile and oval ears are normally used.

Colours are used in cartoons to express deep emotions, situations, eras. Black, dark blue or red can be used for villains or antagonists. Bright colours like yellow represent the protagonist. Hue for a sad atmosphere, saturation for a pure atmosphere, brightness and darkness according to day and night, and many more are used in cartoons. Colours are also used to represent eras, like the 16th century or so, pastel colours are mostly used. The most important thing is that people should easily recognize it. By putting all the colours of the character in order, in a rectangle, people should be able to guess the accurate character. That is the key to cartooning.




